



Article: the drug problem in Switzerland

Drugs, a problem of use: abstinence through enforcement, treatment, and prevention of use (1920-)

HIV/AIDS, a problem linked to drug injection: harm reduction (1980 -)

Drug use: an urban quality of life problem (1990-)

Key ideas

The transportation problem in Montreal

Transportation, a car/truck fluidity problem (speed, congestion) (1940-)

Automobile transportation, an urban quality of life problem (2000-)


