





- Socio-political context (NDP; Quint/CHEP; economic growth; social/health problems in core, inequalities research, 2006, etc.)
- Timing with respect to local processes (after 2 years announcement, April 2007)
- Availability of resources (context of economic growth + core health, social, and infrastructure problems)
- How program/intervention is understood by participants at various levels (health/social related money held in trust by Saskatoon Regional Health)

Station 20 West Celebration!

\$8 million dollars of Provincial funding was announced by Premier

\$8 Million For Station 20 West Community Enterprise Centre

- Socio-political context (Saskatchewan Party elected fall 2007 following long NDP reign; rural oriented party; economic growth; market-place solutions favoured, downstream health interventions favoured, etc.)
- ► Timing with respect to local processes (Fall election, April 2008 budget)
- > Availability of resources ("inconceivable additional revenue" premier B.Wall, May, 2008)
- How program/intervention is understood by participants at various levels (mall; competition with free market grocery stores; no apparent understanding of SDH)
